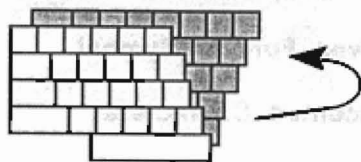
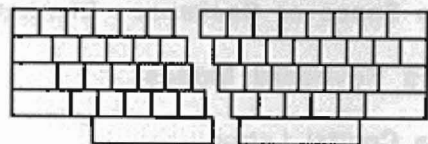

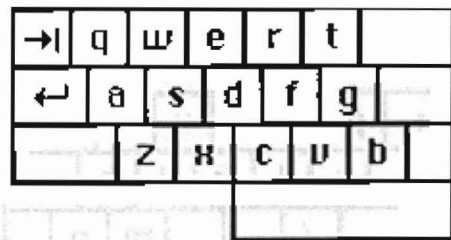

Regular desktop keyboards have two sides (left and right), one for each hand:

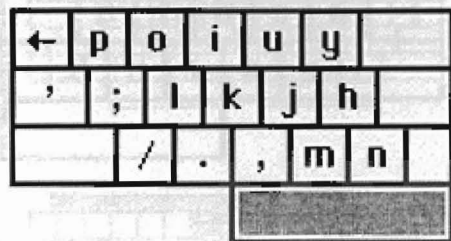


The Half Keyboard has only one side, for the left hand:



The other side of the keyboard is accessed using the space bar.

When you hold down the space bar, the Half Keyboard remaps to the layout of the right side of a regular keyboard:



TYPING A BACKSPACE CHARACTER

To type a backspace character, hold down the space bar and tap the Tab key.

TYPING A FORWARD DELETE

To type a forward delete character, hold down the space bar and tap the Tab key.

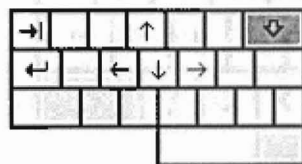
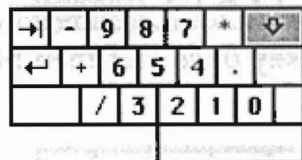
SWITCHING KEYBOARD MODES

The key labelled "A-Z 0-9 <->" is the Mode Switch Key. It allows you to remap the keyboard into a numeric keypad or cursor keys.

For the (default) letter mode, hit the mode switch key once.

For the number pad, hit the mode switch twice.

For scroll mode, hit mode switch 3 times.

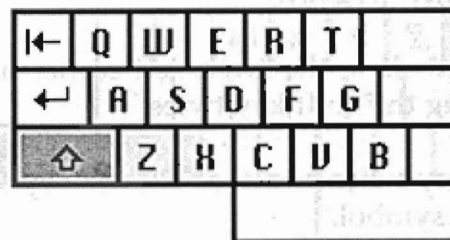


TYPING A CAPITAL LETTER

The Half Keyboard has a feature called Sticky Keys, which lets you use modifier keys without holding them down.

To type a capital-A, you don't need to hold down the Shift key. Simply hit the Shift key once and then hit the key you want capitalized.

Sticky Keys also works for the Ctrl and Alt keys.



TYPING AN EVEN FUNNIER SYMBOL

Even funnier symbols can be typed using the Alt key, in combination with other keys.

Note also that you don't need to physically hold down Alt. Simply tap it once, and it will be active for the next key you type.

TYPING AN ACCENTED CHARACTER

First, type the letter to which you want to add an accent.

Next, tap the Alt key.

Finally, type the accent character.

'	Atl-'	Acute
`	Atl-`	Grave
^	Atl-^	Circumflex
~	Atl-~	Tilde
¨	Atl-¨	Umlaut
°	Atl-°	Aring (with letter å only)

For example, to type é, first type the e, then hit Alt, and then type ' (apostrophe).

TYPING MENU SHORTCUTS

The Ctrl key allows you to issue menu commands directly from your keyboard.

Right-click on the keyboard to open the menu.

Note also that keyboard shortcuts to open the menu are listed below.
