The Art and Science of Prompts

The first thing you need to know is that "prompts" are instructions used to ask Microsoft 365 Copilot to do something for you.

Tell Copilot what you need

There are many types of prompts you can use depending on the task you want to perform.

Think of prompts as a conversation, using simple, yet clear language, and providing context (as you would with an assistant).

You can ask a question, create or summarize a document, edit texts or transform your ideas.

1 Include the right ingredients



To get the best answer, it is important to focus on some of the key elements below when writing Copilot prompts.

Goal What kind of answer do you want from Copilot?

Context What do you need it for? Who is involved?

Source What samples or sources of information should Copilot use?

Expectations How should Copilot respond to better meet your expectations?

Example

Create 3-5 bullet points for a Power Point presentation for the "Phase 5" campaign. Create a summary to talk to client X about their campaign. Focus on the team emails and chats since May.

Please use simple language so I can get up to speed quickly.





Keep the conversation going

Generate content ideas

Start with broader requests and concrete details about the content.



Effective meetings

Request a summary for a meeting and further information about what you should

Support for story-writing

Ask Copilot to write a story, then guide it by providing more relevant details.



Get information

Ask Copilot for a summary of a specific case, and then ask the relevant questions.

Translate to different languages

Ask Copilot to translate a sentence into one of the supported languages, then ask for more context or a regional dialect.

Resolve technical issues

Present a technical problem, then ask for step-by-step guidance.
